FY2022 Grant Program Guidelines

Funding available

- A grant of up to \$82,000

Timeframe

- Submit your application by Wednesday 4th May, 2022

Eligibility

- Australian-based charities with DGR status

State Trustees has developed the Disadvantaged Children grant program to address systemic issues contributing to disadvantage for children. The focus of the program is to enable children's access to education and opportunities to help them grow and thrive.

We are seeking to support initiatives that are community based and deploy collective impact approaches – engaging individuals, families, communities and existing programs.

How much funding is available for a project?

The program provides a grant of up to \$82,000.

Who is eligible?

Australian-based Item 1 DGR organisations which are registered as a charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission and endorsed with charity tax concessions.

We ask for one application per organisation.

Assessment Criteria

All applications will be assessed and ranked against each other. State Trustees are seeking submissions that:

- Address systemic issues impacting children's access to a full education
- Are innovative and take a systems view
- Are community based
- Deploy integrative and collective impact approaches
- Promote cross-sector collaboration
- Provide an evidence base to demonstrate the effectiveness of programs

We are especially interested to support organisations that will widely promote across the community the importance of educational attainment.

What are the timeframes?

Applications open on Wednesday 6th April 2022 and close at midnight Wednesday (end of day), 4th May 2022.
